FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

April 28, 2024

WELCOME! We are pleased to have you join us this morning to worship the Risen Savior and celebrate the forgiveness that we have through Him.

AS WE GATHER - How far can the human voice travel? Scientists tell us that the normal outdoor range for an adult voice traveling through still air is about 180 meters or 590 feet. Communication in Silbo, a whistled language of Spanish-speaking inhabitants of the Canary Islands, can travel five miles under ideal conditions. The sound of a voice traveling across still water at night can range up to 10.5 miles. Voices can carry! The message that the voices carry is what is most important. The spoken message about Jesus shared by Philip the deacon with the Ethiopian stranger made an eternal difference in that man's life. The words that we speak and the messages that we share are of great importance and have the divine potential to "spread the reign of God the Lord" (*LSB* 830:1).

FIRST READING

Acts 8:26-40

(Philip witnesses about Jesus to the Ethiopian official.)

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. ²⁷And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." ³⁰So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³²Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter

and like a lamb before its shearer is silent,

so he opens not his mouth.

³³In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch

said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁸And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. ³⁹And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

1 John 4:1–11

(An exhortation to lives of Christian love)

¹Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. ²By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you heard was coming and now is in the world already. ⁴Little children, you are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. ⁵They are from the world; therefore they speak from the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us; whoever is not from God does not listen to us. By this we know the Spirit of truth and the spirit of error.




HOLY GOSPEL

DISTRIBUTION

Regarding the Sacrament of Holy Communion

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is a holy meal, instituted and commanded by our Lord Jesus Himself, for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith. As Lutheran Christians we believe what the Bible teaches us concerning Holy Communion: that <u>Christ is present</u> in this Sacrament and that with the bread and wine we receive the very body and blood of Christ. The Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions, to which Bethlehem Lutheran Church is committed, teach that in order to receive the Lord's Supper for your benefit a person should first be:

(1) Baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit; and

(2) Understand the nature and meaning of the Sacrament; and

(3) Able to examine himself or herself about the Sacrament and their faith.

Since our Lord desires that we receive Him and the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation in Holy Communion, all who intend to receive His Supper are asked to thoroughly examine their hearts to give honest answer to the following questions:

- Do I know and believe that I am a sinful person? Am I sorry for my sins?

- Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my Savior?

- Do I believe that God mercifully forgives my sins on account of Jesus Christ, and that I am saved solely by His grace?

- Do I believe that by His Word and promise, Jesus Christ is truly—not merely symbolically—present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion with His very Body and Blood?

- Do I plan, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to live a Godly life?

As God grants you to answer "Yes" to these important questions, we invite you to come share in the Lord's Supper. If you have any questions, please speak with the pastor.


